**Area of Interest:**  
Commercial Pilot's License

Imagine yourself as a young man in a relatively poor Caribbean country with ambitions that might not seem attainable to most. This certainly seemed to be the case for Keston Baynes as he was growing up in St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

But Keston wasn't willing to accept what might seem impossible odds. At 14, he won a tennis scholarship that enabled him to travel alone to Florida for tennis training.

Several years later he graduated cum laude in the field of computer science and followed that with a position in a bank in Kingston, soon moving up to the head teller position. While he clearly was being successful, Keston also realized that his education and work were not fulfilling his real ambition -- to become a pilot.

Interest in aviation has grown in St. Vincent since the recent opening of a new international airport. It's helping spur the tourism economy while also creating an immediate need for new pilots for the growing number of local airlines.

Keston is working toward his

goal of becoming a commercial pilot. He is training in a commercial aviation program in Florida. As might be expected, it is both a difficult and expensive career option to pursue. Keston's Hunter's Fund grant is providing an initial first step toward his goals and is helping secure the educational loans he will need to complete the commercial airline pilot training program.

# Adventures With Hunter

Hunter was one of my first and oldest friends in the world. In fact, I have a picture from my 1st birthday, in Mustique, with Hunter. And from the day on which that picture was taken, Hunter and I went on to craft some of the most amazing memories I have. We grew closer while having fun together.

Having a lot of stories to tell from our Mustique days, I was a little bit undecided, and so I made the choice of sharing a story from a place where Hunter and I didn't get to spend as much time together as I would have wished for... Washington DC.

When I was 17, I embarked with my family on a US college tour and made it a point to spend time with the friends I had in each city we visited.

Hunter has always been my main cultural reference when I imagined how Americans and their lifestyle would be - having heard so many stories from his life back home. I was so excited to see him there.

I met up with him at "Dolley", the Watson Home in Virginia, better known as US HQ of Fun. I remember he was in trouble during those days because he had hosted a party that got a little bit out of hand. Nevertheless, we were both

so happy that Judy and Jerry granted him a 'free pass' since I was in town.

I was enchanted as he brought me down to the infamous basement. Seeing the then empty stage of Blackout Band actually made me feel so nostalgic. I remember I used to tell Hunter I was going to be his manager.

At some point, I told Hunter I wanted to live a real 'American night', at which he told me: "I got you, bro!".

We headed over to the mall, where we met with Liam and settled on a Mexican restaurant. Hunter explained that after we would go to an iParty... Showed me the event on Facebook, and it actually looked like fun. I told him that we might have a problem because I didn't have a 'fake ID,' at which he replied: "Don't worry. They will ask for your ID... Only to make sure you are under 18! Because that's the rule of the party".

It turns out that he was himself one of the organizers of this event and that the whole concept behind it was that it would be a safe and fun environment in which under-18-year-olds could party and feel as if they were in a club.

I was amazed and also remembered thinking, "Damn. How cool is Hunter!" and how lucky I was to have a friend like him.

At the end of the dinner, we asked the waiter for Tequila shots, which he refused to bring. Wrong people to challenge, though. After some strategizing, we proceeded to ask a 20-something looking guy to help us out and order two shots for each of us, and we gave him the cash. The moment

the bartender poured them, we ran to the bar, snatched them, downed them, and ran out - a smooth operation. We ran all the way to the rooftop of Tysons Mall, as Hunter wanted to show me the DC 'Skyline' of where I would potentially end up living.

Truly a magical moment.

After that, it was time to hit the iParty. Once inside, I was overwhelmed by the number of people jumping onto Hunter and hugging him, dragging him away, cracking jokes... I was struggling to keep up with the names of everyone. We were walking around the party as if we owned the place - Hunter was king. We even managed to drink some booze from people who sneaked it in.

I had such a fun time, with my 'bro' Hunter and Liam, at my first ever American party. I remember his Dad came to pick us up, and we were laughing so much in the car, trying to hide that we were tipsy and awkwardly answering his Dad's questions about the night.

I will always remember that night. Not only as a great night with a close friend, not just as one of my first American experiences, but also as the night I decided that DC is where I would go to College.

So for that, I can only say THANK YOU, HUNTER.

I miss him. And I wonder how many great nights we would be having now. And I hope that from up in the sky, he's living vicariously through me from time to time. It would bring me great honor.

# How 20 Young Friends who met on Mustique are Changing the World

In 2016, Hunter Watson's promising life was tragically ended when he was fatally injured as a passenger in a distracted driving automobile collision.

In the months following Hunter's death, his family and friends and the communities in which he was nurtured, including Mustique Island, all searched for a way to continue his presence and ideals.

His friends, nearly all 20-year-olds, were part of a new generation of young people who had grown up during a time when ideas were changing the world. Hunter's imagination and personal accomplishments had always tested these ideas, and much of this imagination emerged during his family's vis-

its to the Island of Mustique.

Mustique is a place that attracts the world's leaders in music, performing arts, computer science, and entrepreneurship where they can relax and enjoy time with their families. In this environment, everyone seemed to be the same, but the energy of their achievements flowed into the imagination of Hunter and his friends. They could see firsthand how those around them had impacted the world with their ideas, and they began to believe that anything was possible.

What his friends loved about Hunter was how he made sure all new to the Island were included with those who had come since childhood and that they explored all the Island had to offer.

Hunter's loss was, for many of this group, their first realization that their close "band of friends" might not be intact forever, so at this young age, they formed a charity that would support the ideals found in Hunter and others like him.

They would seek out young people like Hunter, who had the imagination for an idea but lacked the financial resources to see where it could go.

The Fund aims to keep Hunter's energy and optimism alive by giving grants to help young people's involvement in the fields of those they met on Mustique - performing arts, music, computer science, and entrepreneurship.

Twenty young men and women organized themselves into

working groups, and since most live throughout the US, England, Italy, France, and Mustique, meet regularly on video conference calls. They move the programs forward, including fundraising, grant application evaluations, and the awarding of grants. Their second program was formed to prevent the loss of life from distracted driving and has already become established on 25 school campuses where thousands of students are signing pledges not to drive distracted.

Memories of Hunter's spirit, interests, and love will always remain with his family and friends, but it is so gratifying to see how many people his life has touched and the good things that are being accomplished in his memory.

## How Grants are Selected

It might seem a relatively easy process for Hunter's Fund to award grants to deserving individuals - an application is submitted, the application is reviewed, and the grantee is sent a check.

The Committee insists on a more thorough approach.

Hunter's Fund has been established to provide support to young people between 16 and 26 years old who have innovative ideas for projects within the Fund's focus of interest. And while the application is long and detailed, it is

still a difficult evaluation task for the 20 volunteers who review and grade the many applications.

The reason is that most of the applications are proposing truly new, often innovative ideas, ideas about which they are excited and passionate, but which can be difficult to measure while still only in the idea stage.

To do this, the application consists of mostly essay type questions that give the reviewers a chance to feel the applicant's passion. Since each reviewer

brings different areas of interest, experience, and expertise to the evaluation process, the scores are totaled to give an overall score that can be compared with other applications.

To support new ideas as they are developed, the Fund accepts applications twice a year.

Before final approval, the Grants Committee asks applicants with the most promising ideas to submit a 2-minute cell phone video to express their idea visually.

After a grant is approved, a careful follow-up procedure takes place. Each grantee is assigned a mentor, with whom they check in regularly, reporting on progress and problems, and there is careful monitoring of how the awarded money compares with the original budget.

The grants awarded clearly have gone to deserving individuals. And each round of applications is much larger than the last and just as challenging to evaluate. We are looking forward to that.

Every year thousands of lives, like Hunter's, are lost as a result of fatal automobile crashes.

Teens and young adults are the largest age group involved in distracted driving accidents. Texting and cell phones are suspected as major causes. But eating, socializing while driving and even putting on make-up are also causes of distracted driving.

Hunter's Fund has launched more than 25 campaigns on


campuses in the US where students sign Hunter's Pledge Not to Drive Distracted and receive a free wristband in return. Studies have shown that signing a written pledge results in a 47% better chance of changing behavior than any other incentive.

Efforts are underway to expand these campaigns to St. Vincent

and the UK by providing free of charge, posters, pledge forms, and wrist bands to young people signing pledge forms.

Each member of the Hunter's Fund was a close friend of Hunter Watson. They wanted to award and encourage young people with novel and creative ideas who might not ordinarily receive recognition or win awards. Three years later, the Committee has reviewed and graded hundreds of applications and identified more than 30 such dreamers who could not have explored their dreams without financial assistance. 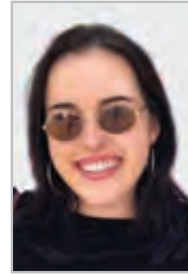
**Ilana Dunn**

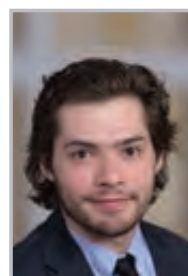
 **Matt Kimm**

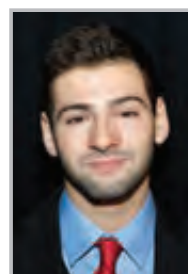
 **Jordan Parent**

Three months ago, she was able to pick up where she left off and is now sharing a shop with a fellow entrepreneur. The shop is centrally located and easily accessible in uptown Kingston. It is close to where the cruise ships dock, so it's an ideal location to attract walk-in traffic when the cruise business starts up again next year. Her purchase of a new domestic sewing machine, thanks to the grant, is helping her business – she's busy making clothes and doing alterations. Her old customers are glad to see her back – and her customer base is growing. She hopes to get an industrial sewing machine next year which she'll use to make her handbags. "The grant helped me get back to work after the baby was born and find a physical space to locate my business. It gave me the boost I needed to keep working towards my other goals – including having my own shop and launching the pickup and drop off system that other startup businesses can subscribe to – which I hope to achieve next year. 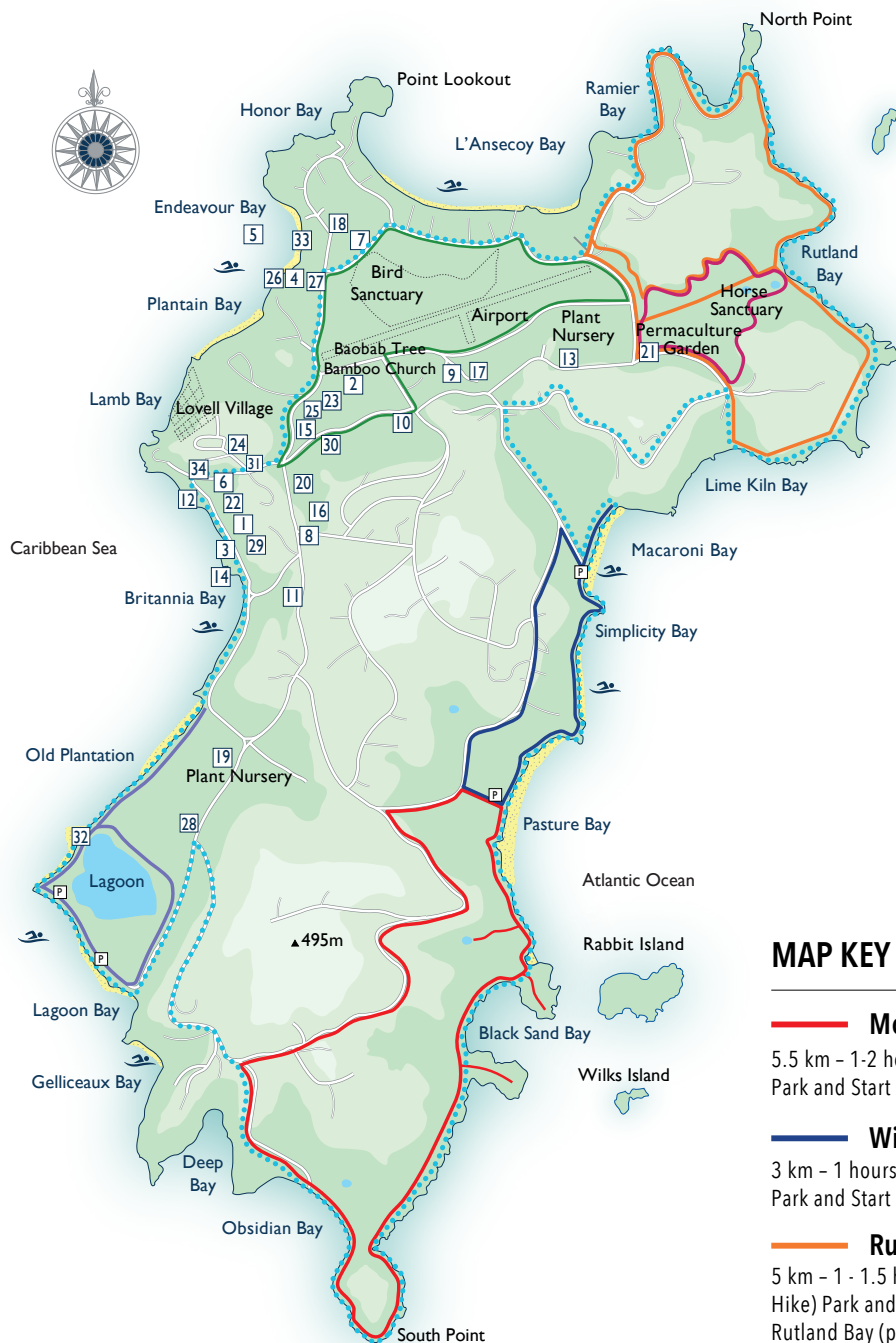
## FOR NEW FRIENDS TO MUSTIQUE AND EVEN SOME OF US

## Charity Begins on Mustique

The proverb, charity begins at home, dates to the time of the Roman comic playwright, Terence (about 190-159 BC). Over the years, the definition has evolved. In 1383, John Wycliffe wrote: "charity should begin at himself." Five hundred years later Dickens said, "charity begins at home, and justice begins next door." The Cambridge Dictionary definition is "you should take care of your family and other people who live close to you before helping people who live further away or in another country."

Charities on Mustique are the embodiment of this proverb and are engaged in a variety of activities to serve different needs of the local population. Hunter's Fund applauds their work while it continues its focus on: saving lives through its distracted driving campaigns and encouraging entrepreneurship through its grant programs. Here's a list of the charities which are actively working to improve the lives of the local population:

**Basil Charles Educational Foundation** - started in 1996. The Foundation started a scholarship program to help offset the cost of secondary education and make it more accessible to those in need. Additionally, funds support early childhood education and a stem summer program. Most of the funding comes from the revenue generated by the annual Mustique Blues Festival.

**Hunter's Fund** - established in 2016 by Hunter's friends from Mustique who were devastated by the loss of their friend Hunter Watson who died as a passenger in a distracted driving accident. They wanted to help young people from St. Vincent and the Grenadines who had visions of something they wanted to be but lacked the resources to explore those dreams and whose parents worked so hard to make this paradise possible. Funding for the Mustique program is provided exclusively by visitors and homeowners who come to our beautiful island and want to help fund the dreams of these young people.

**Mustique Charitable Trust** - founded in 2008 and funded by the homeowners of Mustique. The mission is to improve the opportunities of children, young people and vulnerable adults while supporting the development of sustainable local communities throughout SVG. The Trust aims to coordinate and enhance the charitable giving of the Mustique community.

**Mustique Educational Trust** - established 30 years ago by Mick Jagger, Basil Charles and Ouida Touche, it was founded to establish a primary school for the children of Mustique and secondary school support for the children of those who work on Mustique. Additional activities include the provision of interest-free loans for post-secondary education, adult education programs such as literacy, math, computers and skill training.

**Mustique Medical Trust** - In cooperation with Dr. Michael Bunbury, the Trust provides funds for emergency services for the local population. Funded primarily from donations from grateful patients and others who value the availability of emergency services.

**SVG Environment Fund** - founded a couple of years ago by Bryan Adams, is a non-profit dedicated to supporting the most effective environmental projects and campaigns. The Fund gives grants to both organizations and individuals actively engaged in the region, and with its partners, works to protect and restore the natural environment and influence local and visitors to be more respectful of their surroundings.

If a charity needs to be validated, there's a one-time validation fee of £35. The overseas transaction fee is £20, and the minimum you can donate overseas is £250.

The inspiration and our mission come from Hunter himself. He was a young man of extremely diverse talents and interests. Wherever he went, whatever he did, he brought a spark and a smile and a contagious energy that inspired those around him.

And while his life was too short, and the hurt that those who loved him feel will never fully heal, there is a peace that comes from knowing that Hunter succeeded in *getting the most out of every day he lived*:

**As a boy and a young man ...** Hunter lit up the lives of his mother, Judy, his father, Jerry, his older brother, Teddy, and all his extended family.

**As a friend ...** Hunter cultivated deep and lasting relationships and will never be forgotten by those who knew him best.

**As an athlete ...** Hunter loved baseball, soccer, football and wrestling, excelling as an individual while always striving to lift up his teammates.

**As a musician ...** Hunter formed his first band at age 10 and never stopped loving, playing and performing music. (You can watch a video of Hunter's Black Out Band playing their song "Video Games" on YouTube.)

**As a student ...** Hunter graduated from Potomac School, enrolled at Syracuse University and joined Phi Kappa Psi, learning and growing and making new friends each year — while never forgetting his old ones.

**As an entrepreneur ...** Hunter worked with area nightclubs to encourage teens-only, no-alcohol nights which he then managed and promoted. He was also beginning work on his own technology-based business.

**As a person ... there will never be another Hunter.** While he had many interests, he was one-of-a-kind. Thank you for supporting Hunter's Fund, so that young men and women with talent, energy and passion can have a chance to follow their dreams ... *just as Hunter did every day.*

## Distracted Driving - Changing Behavior is the Answer

Hunter's Fund's efforts to change the behavior of young people with respect to distracted driving arose from the untimely death in 2016 of Hunter Watson, a passenger in a distracted driving crash. Hunter's Fund found that its campus events where students were asked to sign a pledge not to drive while distracted were working! In fact, **studies have shown that signing a written pledge can change behavior 47% more than any other incentive!**

The recognition that more needs to be done to change behaviors and attitudes towards distracted driving has grown since 2016; driving while distracted is getting noticed as the growing problem that it is. Distracted drivers are striking kids exiting school buses, pedestrians in crosswalks, cyclists sharing the road, and police officers at road stops. Hunter's Fund welcomes the efforts of other organizations who are focusing on the problem of distracted driving. Here's a sample:

The findings in the January 2019 report released by the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS) includes results from a 2018 survey conducted by the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety and the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute. David Kidd, co-author of the IIHS study said: "The latest data suggest that drivers are using their phones in riskier ways. ... studies consistently link manipulating a cellphone while driving to increased crash risk." In fact, fatal crash risk is 66% higher when controlling a phone.

In an April 6, 2019 press release, AAA announced its new campaign to reduce distracted driving. Called 'Don't Drive Intoxicated,' the campaign compares drinking and driving to texting and driving. "Distracted driving is such a widespread, dangerous and potentially deadly behavior that AAA must be innovative in its efforts to raise awareness and effect change," said Shawn Steward, spokesperson for AAA Kansas.

According to the Harvard Gazette, July 2, 2019, nearly 38,000 people lost their lives in traffic crashes last year, up 12 percent since 2014, and 4.5 million people were seriously injured. Distracted driving has been identified as a key factor in the recent rise. The Harvard T.H. Chan School's Center for Health Communication is developing a campaign aimed at raising awareness of the need for drivers to remain focused. According to Jay Winsten, the School's associate dean for communication, "Progress will come from a combination of tougher laws, stricter enforcement, technological innovation, community mobilization, and public campaigns."

Public campaigns are exactly what many student groups, working with Hunter's Fund, are organizing on campuses. The results speak for themselves. This past school year, over 600 volunteers on 17 campuses convinced more than ten thousand students across the country to signed "Hunter's Pledge" to end Distracted Driving— and are saving lives.
