Mental Health Support for Children

Julonna Peterson is passionate about supporting students with special education needs and providing teachers in St. Vincent and the Grenadines with the resources they need to create inclusive learning environments.

Her company The PERFECT Project is working to support students with special education needs by creating specially tailored kits, workbooks, and resources for children, parents, and teachers.

The grant from Hunter's Fund will help purchase materials for the workbooks and shipping supplies so they can be distributed around the country.

Julonna Peterson Pivots During COVID-19 Pandemic

It was still early in the pandemic when St. Vincent native Julonna Peterson won a Hunter's Grant for her company "The PERFECT Project," which provides specialized educational resources for children living with mental disabilities.

Peterson, who has a degree in psychology, was inspired by the idea of "supporting children with special education needs" by distributing educational materials to help teachers in the Caribbean create more inclusive learning environments for all types of students.

"I was employed as a teacher's aide for a client who has ADHD and Autism, and through this experience, I was able to understand

deeply the intelligence, uniqueness, and immense learning potential of children with such diagnosis," Peterson says.

When the COVID-19 pandemic forced schools across the Caribbean to close their doors, Peterson had to switch up her strategy. If teachers weren't in the classrooms, she would have to meet the students where they were: at home, with their parents.

"COVID did affect part of my market, part of the population I was expecting to reach," Peterson says. "Now, parents have reached out to me, and said that it's been so difficult teaching the children from home while working."

Since schools began to close, Peterson has focused on reaching out to parents with children at home and providing them with educational posters and pamphlets to ease the stress of remote schools. Her most popular product? Posters that break down the tricky multiplication tables.

"The posters really help a lot because even when the parents have to leave for work, the child can walk up and use the poster. It helps children with the visual side of learning, and it helps parents from having to teach their children," Peterson says.

How a Hunter's Grant Recipient Tripled Revenue at His Travel Agency During the COVID-19 Pandemic



Cenus Hinds

Cenus Hinds has always been ambitious. The St. Vincent native and self-proclaimed “serial entrepreneur” won a grant from Hunter's Fund in 2021 for his company Cariway, a boutique travel agency that connects travelers to local hosts in popular island destinations. Cariway isn't your average travel agency — it's specifically focused on supporting local economies by highlighting community businesses that offer unique activities from kayaking to volcano tours and even adventures in rum tasting.

But when the COVID-19 pandemic brought travel to a near standstill, Hinds pivoted Cariway's strategic plan. Instead of focusing on attracting tourists, the company would concentrate on providing tourism experiences to locals living on the island. In doing so, Cariway's average monthly revenue increased by more than three-fold, all during the ongoing pandemic.

“We live in a society where tourism experiences and fun

things have been reserved for foreigners,” Hinds says. “But foreign travel just isn't happening right now with COVID-19.”

In recent months, 90 to 95 percent of Cariway's customers have been locals on the island.

“They're just people on the island who are bored and looking for something different to do,” Hinds says. “And when we offer these experiences to locals, they quickly take advantage of them.”

In order to attract the new customer base, Hinds turned to the internet and social media. Fortunately, his background in tech and web design came in handy.

“I actually have a background in social media, software development, and website building, so it's kind of what I came from going into this,” Hinds says. “And at the beginning, I kind of had to do it myself. Everything was pretty much self funded.”

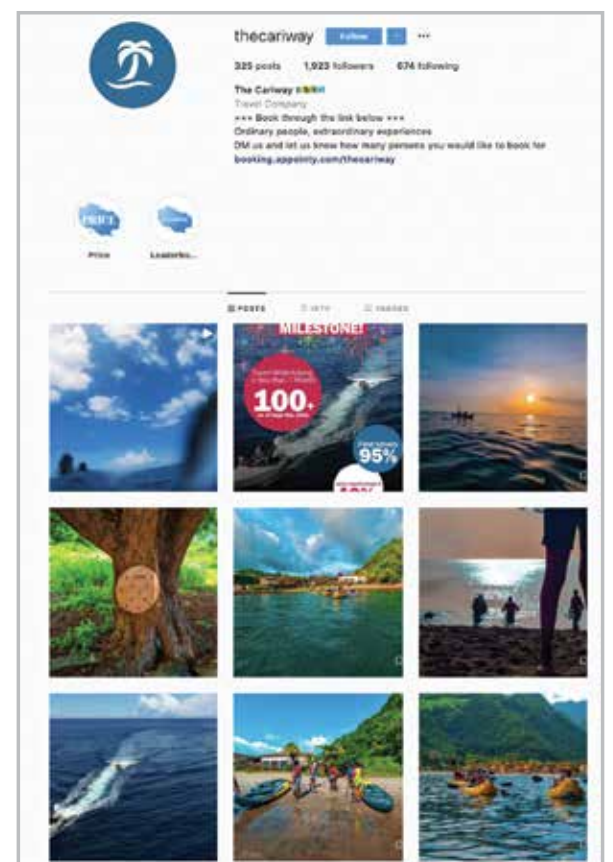
Since receiving a grant from Hunter's Fund, Hinds has hired a dedicated social media coordinator who now runs the brand's social profiles on Instagram, Facebook, and Twitter.

In order to grow Cariway's social media and web audience, Hinds says he focused on encouraging prior customers to share content and post reviews about their

Cariway experiences. He also asked locals what activities they would be most interested in, and curated the brand's content around their responses.

“I think one of the biggest things in growing the website was understanding what it is people wanted to see, and how I could fit that in what I was offering as a business. So one of the things that I did a lot of is blog posts focused on topics that people are most interested in,” Hinds says. “A big thing was also asking people to review and upload pictures of their experiences. That has definitely helped us jump to the top.”

Mentorship Program Supports and Connects Hunter's Fund Grant Winners In St. Vincent



Since 2017, Hunter's Fund has distributed hundreds of thousands of dollars to young entrepreneurs across the globe. But

money is only half of the equation when it comes to developing a start-up business or project — the other half is mentorship.

The Hunter's Fund mentorship program was developed in 2021 by Program Manager Laurel Holmes to create an opportunity for grant winners to receive ongoing, project-based guidance and support after receiving their funds.

"My goal in redeveloping the Mentorship Program is to further the impact of the resources we are providing to our grant recip-

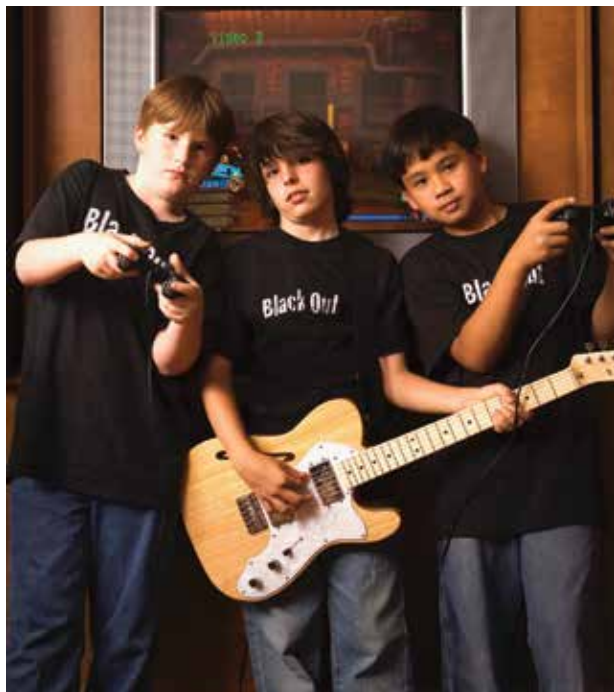
ients," Holmes says. "Not only are we giving them financial support, but we are also now working to provide them opportunities for education, networking, and professional growth."

The program pairs grant recipients with mentors in their field who can help them strategize timely, attainable goals for their project and use their grant money efficiently. Each pair outlines goals for the year and meets virtually once a month to work through problems and develop a strategic plan for the month.

"I hope that both grant winners and mentors are able to grow from this program, whether that be personally, professionally, or both," Holmes says. "My goal is that the wisdom and advice imparted on our grant winners will be things that they may carry with them throughout the one-year grant project process and then beyond into their careers and lives, as their project continues to grow and flourish."

Your Support and Hunter's Grants Builds on Gladwell's 10,000 Hour Theory of Success

"We overlook just how large a role we all play--and by 'we' I mean society--in determining who makes it and who doesn't."

That's an excerpt from journalist Malcolm Gladwell's best-selling book *Outliers: The Story of Success*. Throughout *Outliers*, Gladwell argues that the most successful, high-achieving people in the world — from business tycoons and multi-millionaires to Nobel Peace Prize winners and famous artists and athletes — reached the pinnacles

of success not solely through self-will or innate talent, but through a series of outside factors and lucky life circumstances.

One of Gladwell's theories says that it takes 10,000 hours of "deliberate practice" to achieve mastery in any field. According to his theory, anyone who practices a specific skill for 10,000 hours — or 20 hours a week for 10 years — will become world-class in their endeavor.

But more often than not, young people without strong financial resources and support systems lack the time and energy to devote themselves toward developing their skills and passions — leaving success out of reach despite their innate talent.

"Today many parents are not even able to provide for the education and basic needs of their children. They are hesitant to give a talented son or daughter

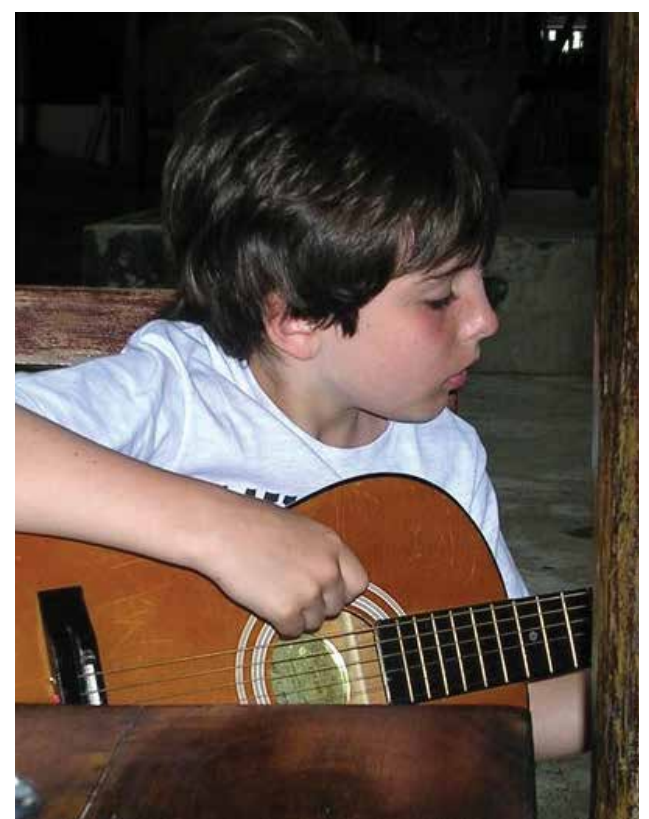
extra help without taking away from the needs of their brother or sisters," says Jerry Watson, co-founder of Hunter's Fund.

Hunter's Fund frequently receives applications from young people seeking funds to purchase the necessary equipment to practice their skills and develop their creative projects. Many of these applicants have dedicated their free time to refine their crafts but found themselves unable to make progress without the right tools.

"One applicant could not afford the cost of equipment to make a demo of his songs. We provided him with recording equipment so he could accomplish this on his own schedule and at the same time learn the art of mixing his music," Watson says. "Two years later, he was awarded a record-


ing contract from Epic Records and is now on tour where thousands are enjoying the music he dreamed of sharing."

Through financial aid and dedicated mentorship, Hunter's Fund is working to empower young people to pursue their intrinsic passions, find fulfillment in their work, and inspire a new generation of creative thinkers.

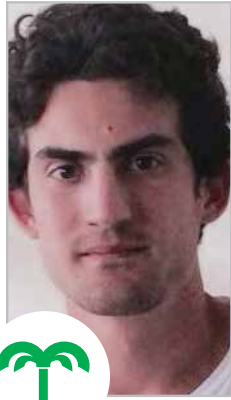


Hunter practicing guitar at Basil's Bar

Hunter's Team

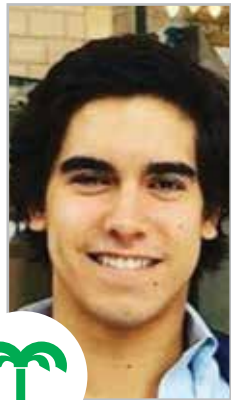

Each member of the Hunter's Fund was a close friend of Hunter Watson. Their encouragement led the Watson family to establish the Hunter Watson Memorial Fund, with Hunter's Team making the important decisions. At first, the family thought this group of college-age students would award financial aid scholarships to students, but when they met for the first time, it became clear they had something more unique in mind. They wanted to award and encourage young people with novel and creative ideas who might not ordinarily receive recognition or win awards. Three years later, the Committee has reviewed and graded hundreds of applications and identified more than 60 young dreamers including many in the UK and on St. Vincent who could not have explored their dreams without financial assistance. Each of our grantees is also "mentored" by one of the Team Members.

Three days before we left, my university, like all American universities, told us that we would be switching to remote learning. I brought my laptop and one small bag of clothes and got on the plane with a scarf tied around my face because nobody owned masks yet. We ended up staying in Mustique for three months.

I sat at the one desk we had in our house with my brother Rory and his two friends - Magnus and Max - as we tried to focus on online university together. It became normal for my classmates on zoom to see different family members or friends on my screen in bathing suits behind me.

Entering Mustique was almost impossible at this time. Most airlines had cancelled all international flights and a new testing protocol was going in place for those few people who could even get to Barbados or St. Lucia. Because the community was so contained we felt safe to socialize with the other people on Mustique at the time. This was the best part of lockdown in Mustique - and the core part of what Mustique means to so many of us - being able to bond with a small and close knit group of people from all over the world.

One of my favorite memories was a night we all went down to Basil's Bar. It was far from the atmosphere we all know and love - it had closed down completely. We brought down a cooler and some snacks to watch the sunset. When it got dark we lit candles and played music from a little speaker. We sat in the dark late into the night feeling enormously lucky just to be able to sit and talk with one another.

Charity Begins on Mustique

The proverb, charity begins at home, dates to the time of the Roman comic playwright, Terence (about 190-159 BC). Over the years, the definition has evolved. In 1383, John Wycliffe wrote: "charity should begin at himself." Five hundred years later Dickens said, "charity begins at home, and justice begins next door." The Cambridge Dictionary definition is "you should take care of your family and other people who live close to you before helping people who live further away or in another country."

Charities on Mustique are the embodiment of this proverb and are engaged in a variety of activities to serve different needs of the local population. Hunter's Fund applauds their work while it continues its focus on: saving lives through its distracted driving campaigns and encouraging entrepreneurship through its grant programs. Here's a list of the charities which are actively working to improve the lives of the local population:

Basil Charles Educational Foundation - started in 1996. The Foundation started a scholarship program to help offset the cost of secondary education and make it more accessible to those in need. Additionally, funds support early childhood education and a stem summer program. Most of the funding comes from the revenue generated by the annual Mustique Blues Festival.

Hunter's Fund - established in 2016 by Hunter's friends from Mustique who were devastated by the loss of their friend Hunter Watson who died as a passenger in a distracted driving accident. They wanted to help young people from St. Vincent and the Grenadines who had visions of something they wanted to be but lacked the resources to explore those dreams and whose parents worked so hard to make this paradise possible. Funding for the Mustique program is provided exclusively by visitors and homeowners who come to our beautiful island and want to help fund the dreams of these young people.

Mustique Charitable Trust - founded in 2008 and funded by the homeowners of Mustique. The mission is to improve the opportunities of children, young people and vulnerable adults while supporting the development of sustainable local communities throughout SVG. The Trust aims to coordinate and enhance the charitable giving of the Mustique community.

Mustique Educational Trust - established 30 years ago by Mick Jagger, Basil Charles and Ouida Touche, it was founded to establish a primary school for the children of Mustique and secondary school support for the children of those who work on Mustique. Additional activities include the provision of interest-free loans for post-secondary education, adult education programs such as literacy, math, computers and skill training.

Mustique Medical Trust - In cooperation with Dr. Michael Bunbury, the Trust provides funds for emergency services for the local population. Funded primarily from donations from grateful patients and others who value the availability of emergency services.

SVG Environment Fund - founded a couple of years ago by Bryan Adams, is a non-profit dedicated to supporting the most effective environmental projects and campaigns. The Fund gives grants to both organizations and individuals actively engaged in the region, and with its partners, works to protect and restore the natural environment and influence local and visitors to be more respectful of their surroundings.

If you sometimes wonder if the support you've given to Hunter's Fund has made a difference, the answer is in the responses we've received from our grant winners. You may have never personally met any of these innovative young people, but your generosity has helped each of them turn their dreams and passions into reality.

WHAT IS A CAF CHARITY ACCOUNT?

The CAF Charity Account is a way for UK taxpayers to organise their charitable giving to support all their favourite causes from one account by setting up regular standing orders or making one-off donations. Opening a CAF Charity Account is quick and easy - simply complete their online application form and agree to top-up with at least £10 per month. The whole process, including setting up your Direct Debit, should take no more than five minutes.

Give more with Gift Aid

Complete just one Gift Aid Declaration Form, and CAF will automatically add 25p to every £1 you give.

Overseas donations

Just complete a CAF overseas donation request for the charity you want to donate to. They'll even validate the charity for you, to make sure your donation is going to a legitimate project, and arrange for your donation to be paid to them. If a charity needs to be validated, there's a one-time validation fee of £35. The overseas transaction fee is £20, and the minimum you can donate overseas is £250.

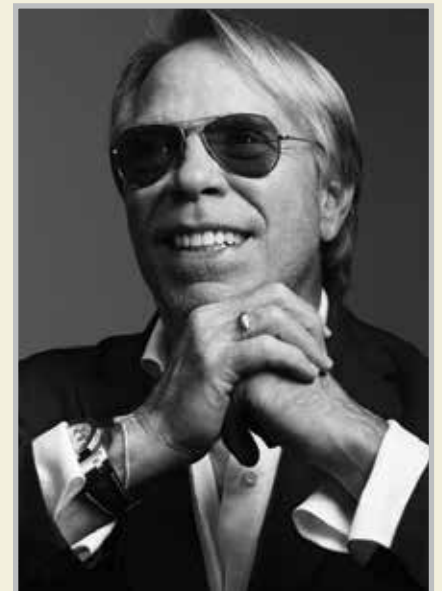
"It Could Save Someone's Life"
